The Embassy had been revived spectacularly by Jeremy Norman, opening in 1978 at almost the same time as the dance film Saturday Night Fever premiered. The Club opened with a star-studded fashion show by Ossie Clark, where guests included Lady Diana Cooper and Margaret, Duchess of Argyll. Norman employed Michael Fish, the men's fashion designer and society darling, as his "greeter". The club was an instant success and its heyday lasted for about two years until the fashion for Disco faded in 1980. During the period of Norman's ownership, the Embassy played host to nearly all the prominent names in the entertainment, fashion and young society worlds - a melting pot and crossroads of many cultures. As at New York's Studio 54, everyone came out to party, young and old, including many who had never come out on the scene before.
